ORGANIZATIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY OBSERVATIONS

While working at Google, my understanding of community, environmental, and global impact has increased immensely. Referring to the documents I've read, I found it interesting to read more into how the company incorporates social responsibility in its work environment and culture. I've never thought much as to how Google creates a safe place for us to work. I've understood the parameters surrounding the food they provide, the amenities, and the office spaces, but I've never pinpointed my focus on their attempts to make the office "safe" culturally.

To me, and in my own words, organizational/corporate social responsibility entails the company being cognizant of other important factors, whether that be socially, economically, politically, etc., outside of their sphere of influence. 



